School Organisation for 2021—2022


Due to the DFE lifting restrictions around Covid, the following timings will be in place from Wednesday 25th August when the children start back to school.

Over the course of the challenge, children gathered and analysed clues to decide which of the fairy-tale character suspects committed a fictional crime (stealing chocolate). Children were able to apply all eight of the essential skills defined as: Listening, Speaking, Problem Solving, Creativity, Staying Positive, Aiming High, Leadership and Teamwork to examine the crime scene before presenting to the class who they think committed the crime.

These types of challenges and activities are important for our children to build a set of essential skills to succeed in life, giving them the ability to creatively solve problems, to self-manage, to communicate effectively, and to work well with others.
